Awaken conducts outreach and provides direct services to women and girls to help them transition out of commercial sexual exploitation (CSE). Nearly all victims served by Awaken have had a history of emotional, physical, or sexual abuse.

They help program participants with long-term and emergency needs including basic outreach, mentorship services, counseling, transitional housing, transportation, financial aid for college, legal and medical assistance, drop-in center and much more.

Drop-In Center

In January 2016, Awaken, with the support from caring community partners, opened the Awaken Drop-in Center, located off 4th and Spokane Streets, a hot spot for trafficking, prostitution and CSE. Purposefully located, Awaken is removing barriers and increasing accessibility to its programs and services. The center serves individuals' basic and critical needs, including case management, education, counseling, mentoring, food and clothing. They aim to be a place of safety by being a consistent presence that provides immediate tangible needs and resources offerings, help and hope.

The Seeds of Hope program works in collaboration with local law enforcement, FBI, ICE and numerous community service providers to identify, rescue, and restore victims of all forms of human trafficking.

Las Vegas has been identified by a Justice Department risk analysis study as one of 17 cities nationwide most likely to be the top destinations for trafficking victims. Every day in the valley, Seeds of Hope works with both foreign and domestic victims of all ages and ethnic backgrounds.

Through comprehensive case management services, they can provide emergency shelter, transportation, clothing, food, victim advocacy, crises intervention and safety planning, medical and dental care, derivative family member benefits, mental health counseling, employment assistance, legal referrals, substance abuse treatment, access to child care, and other service recommendations.
