COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The Nevada State Board of Massage Therapy (Board), by and through its Executive Director, Sandra Anderson, hereby notifies Shubo Lin-Washmon ("Respondent") of an administrative hearing, which is to be held pursuant to Chapters 233B, 622, 622A of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and 640C of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). The purpose of the hearing is to consider the allegations stated below and to determine if the Respondent should be subject to an administrative penalty as set forth in NRS 640C.710, if the stated allegations are proven at the hearing by the evidence presented.

Respondent is currently and at all times mentioned herein, licensed as a massage therapist in the State of Nevada and is therefore, subject to the jurisdiction of the Board and the provisions of NRS Chapter 640C.

ALLEGED FACTS

IT IS HEREBY ALLEGED AND CHARGED AS FOLLOWS:

1. On or about March 30, 2022, pursuant to a legally noticed complaint, the Board approved a Stipulation for Settlement of Disciplinary Action and issued an Order that placed Respondent on a four-year probation, including a term to comply with all laws governing massage therapy.

- Respondent is and all times relevant herein, the owner of Tea Tree Massage & Spa located at 1350 E. Flamingo Rd., Suite 22, Las Vegas, Nevada 89119 ("Establishment").
- 3. On or about June 9, 2022, Respondent, while working at Establishment was arrested and cited for soliciting sexual activity to an undercover police officer during the course of practicing massage.

- On or about June 17, 2022, Nevada Division of Business Licensing cited the Establishment for doing business without a license (massage).
- On or about March 8, 2023, Qianyi Lin, while working at Establishment, was arrested and cited for soliciting sexual activity to an undercover police officer during the course of practicing massage.
- 6. Respondent knew of Qianyi Lin's conduct and arrest and failed to report to the Board that the employee engaged in unethical or unprofessional conduct as it relates to the practice of massage therapy within thirty (30) days after becoming aware of the conduct.
- On or about March 13, 2023, Respondent submitted a renewal application and failed to disclose the June 9, 2022, arrest.

VIOLATIONS OF LAW

COUNT ONE

 By soliciting sexual activity during the course of practicing a massage, Respondent violated the provisions of NRS 640C.700(4) and/or (9). This is grounds for discipline pursuant to NRS 640C.700(2).

COUNT TWO

9. By failing to report that the holder of a license engaged in unethical or unprofessional conduct as it relates to the practice of massage therapy within thirty (30) days after becoming aware of the conduct, Respondent violated the provisions of NRS 640C.700(10) and/or (9). This is grounds for discipline pursuant to NRS 640C.700(2).

COUNT THREE

10. By violating the terms of probation, Respondent violated the provisions of NRS 640C.700(13) and/or (9). This is grounds for discipline pursuant to NRS 640C.700(2).

COUNT FOUR

 By failing to disclose the June 9, 2022, arrest for soliciting sexual activity, Respondent submitted false, fraudulent or misleading information to the Board violating the provisions of NRS 640C.700(1) and/or (9). This is grounds for discipline pursuant to NRS 640C.700(2).

The purpose of the hearing is to determine if the Respondent has violated the provisions of Chapter 640C of NRS and if the allegations contained herein are substantially proven by the evidence presented to further determine what administrative penalty is to be assessed against the Respondent, if any, pursuant to NRS 640C.710.

Should the Respondent fail to appear at the hearing, a decision may still be reached by the Board. As the Respondent, you are further advised that you may be charged with the attorney's fees and/or costs associated with the hearing pursuant to NRS 622.400.

Pursuant to NRS 233B.121(5), informal disposition of this case may be made by stipulation. agreed settlement, consent order, or default. Any attempt to negotiate this case should be made by contacting Sandra Anderson, (775) 687-9951 or sjanderson@lmt.nv.gov.

Pursuant to NRS 241.033(2)(b), the Nevada State Board of Massage Therapy may, without further notice, take administrative action against your license and/or certificate to practice within the State of Nevada if the Board determines that such administrative action is warranted after considering your character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health.
