## BEFORE THE NEVADA STATE BOARD OF MASSAGE THERAPY

VOLUNTARY SURRENDER IN LIEU OF OTHER DISCIPLINE

Respondent.

- I, Luis Gonzalez, wish to voluntarily surrender my Nevada Massage Therapy License.
  - 1. It is alleged that:

Licensed Massage Therapist

Nevada License No. NVMT.11178,

- a. On or about August 10, 2022, the Board held an administrative hearing against me relative to case number NVMT-C-22016. As a result of the administrative hearing, the Board issued its Finding of Facts, Conclusions of Law and Order that included suspending my license for ninety (90) days, and then placing me on a two (2) year probation.
- b. My probation included the term that "Gonzalez is restricted to clothes clients only."
- c. My probation included the term that "in the event that a violation of this Order is alleged, Gonzalez agrees to surrender his license to the Executive Director, if so requested, and agrees not to practice as a massage therapist until the entry of a final order from the Board."
- d. On or about April 23, 2023, while working at Oriental Thai Spa Massage, located at 3475 S. Las Vegas Blvd., Las Vegas, Nevada 89102, I massaged XX and during the course of the massage, touched her genitals several times and digitally penetrated her.
- e. XX was unclothed or completely nude during the massage.
- f. I gave XX his phone number and told her to call him if she needed a massage in Arizona.

- I admit only that these factual allegations may constitute grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to NRS 640C.710 because the conduct may have violated NRS 640C.700(2) and/or (4) and/or (9), and/or (13).
- 3. I am aware of, understand, and have been advised of the effect of this Voluntary Surrender.
- 4. I have read this Voluntary Surrender and I fully understand and acknowledge its facts and terms.
- 5. I am aware that I have certain constitutional rights, including:
  - (a) I have the right to hire an attorney to represent me in this proceeding;
  - (b) I have the right to demand a hearing on the charges against me, and I can require the Board's staff to prove the allegations;
  - (c) I have the right to cross-examine the witnesses against me;
  - (d) I have the right to call witnesses to provide evidence on my own behalf;
  - (e) I have other rights accorded to me under the Nevada Revised Statutes
    Chapters 233B, 622, 622A and 640C; and
  - (f) I have the right to obtain judicial review of the Board's decision.
- 6. I am aware of the foregoing rights in paragraph five (5), and I voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive these rights in return for the Board accepting my voluntary surrender of my massage therapist license in lieu of other disciplinary action.
- I understand this Voluntary Surrender is considered disciplinary action and as such will become
  part of my permanent record.
- 8. I understand this Voluntary Surrender is considered public information.
- I understand this Voluntary Surrender is considered disciplinary action and will be reported to
  the national repository, which records disciplinary action taken against licensees, or any agency
  or another state, which regulates the practice of Massage Therapy.

## VOLUNTARY WAIVER OF RIGHTS AND NOTICE RERQUIREMENT UNDER NEVADA REVISED STATUTE 241.033 and 241.034

- NRS 241.034(1)(b)(2)<sup>1</sup> provides that "a public body shall not...take administrative action against a person...unless the public body has given written notice... at least 14 calendar days before the meeting."
- In accordance with the right granted by NRS 241.034(1)(b)(2), the respondent hereby voluntarily waives his right to have this administrative hearing heard at least 14 calendar days after written notice.
- 3. NRS 241.033(2)(a)(2)<sup>2</sup> provides that "a public body shall not hold a meeting to consider the character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health of any person...unless it has given written notice...at least 14 calendar days before the meeting."
- In accordance with the rights granted by NRS 241.033, the respondent hereby voluntarily waives his right to have this administrative hearing heard at least 14 calendar days after written notice.
- In accordance with NRS 241.033, the applicant hereby permits the public body to inquire about character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health, and may still go into closed session to do so.
