COMPLAINT AND NOTICE OF HEARING

The Nevada State Board of Massage Therapy (Board), by and through its Executive Director, Elisabeth Barnard, hereby notifies Suhua Sun ("Respondent") of an administrative hearing, which is to be held pursuant to Chapters 233B, 241, 622, and 622A of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and 640C of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS) and the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). The purpose of the hearing is to consider the allegations stated below and to determine if the Respondent should be subject to an administrative penalty as set forth in NRS 640C.710, if the stated allegations are proven at the hearing by the evidence presented.

Respondent is currently and at all times mentioned herein, licensed as a massage therapist in the State of Nevada and is therefore, subject to the jurisdiction of the Board and the provisions of NRS Chapter 640C.

IT IS HEREBY ALLEGED AND CHARGED AS FOLLOWS:

ALLEGED FACTS

- On or about June 6, 2024, Respondent, while employed with Castle Spa & Massage, located at 5980 Spring Mountain Rd., Ste 3, Las Vegas, NV 89146, was cited for soliciting prostitution. (Case Report No. LLV240600024535).
- Specifically, on that day, an undercover Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Officer entered
 Castle Spa & Massage and requested a 30-minue massage.
- 3. The officer was taken to a massage room, told to undress, and lay face down on the massage table under a sheet. Respondent left the room while the officer undressed.

- 4. Respondent re-entered the room and began to massage the officer.
- 5. Respondent massaged the officer's entire body, including his buttocks and inner thighs.
- 6. During the massage, Respondent asked the officer if he wanted "boom boom" while making a thrusting motion with her hips. This question, coupled with the thrusting motion, indicated to the officer that Respondent was offering sexual intercourse.
 - 7. Respondent then instructed the officer to turn over.
- 8. The officer asked how much Respondent would charge for this sex act, to which Respondent asked how much the officer had.
 - 9. The officer responded that he had \$200, to which Respondent stated, "No, \$300."
 - 10. The officer agreed to this amount and requested a condom.
- 11. Respondent left the room to retrieve the condom and returned with a condom in a paper towel.
- 12. Las Vegas Metropolitan Police entered the building and cited Respondent for soliciting prostitution. (Las Vegas Justice Court Case Number: 24-CR-058884).
 - 13. Police also determined that Respondent was operating without a business license.

VIOLATIONS OF LAW

COUNT ONE

14. Soliciting sexual intercourse is defined as "sexual activity" under NAC 640C.400(1). As such, Respondent violated NRS 640C.700(4) by engaging in or soliciting sexual activity during the course of practicing massage.

COUNT TWO

15. As stated herein, Respondent violated the provisions of NRS 640C and NAC 640C, as such, she has violated NRS 640C.700(2).

COUNT THREE

16. As stated herein, Respondent failed to abide by Nevada statutes and regulations relating to the practice of massage therapy, which constitutes "Unethical or unprofessional conduct" under NAC 640C.410(a)(2). As such, Respondent has violated NRS 640C.700(9).

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COUNT FOUR

17. As stated herein, Respondent engaged in sexual contact with the Officer, which constitutes "Unethical or unprofessional conduct" under NAC 640C.410(b)(18). As such, Respondent has violated NRS 640C.700(9).

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Executive Director, Elisabeth Barnard, prays as follows:

1. That the Board conduct a hearing on this complaint as provided by statute, and after such hearing, that the Board impose upon Respondent the discipline permitted by NRS 640C.710, which may include the following, (a) the imposition of an administrative fine of not more than \$5,000.00 per violation, (b) recovery of reasonable investigative fees and costs incurred, (c) recovery of attorney fees pursuant to NRS 622.400, (d) licensee be publicly reprimanded, (e) suspend, revoke or place conditions on the licensee's license, (f) place the licensee on probation, and/or (g) such other impositions as may be permitted by Nevada law.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that a disciplinary hearing has been set to consider this Administrative Complaint against the above-named Respondent in accordance with Chapters 233B, 622, 622A and 640C of the Nevada Revised Statutes.

THE HEARING WILL TAKE PLACE on Wednesday, January 8, 2025, commencing at 9:00 a.m. or as soon thereafter, at 254 E Plumb Ln., Suite 254, Reno, NV 89502. The hearing may also be attended virtually via Zoom. The Zoom information is as follows:

PURSUANT TO NRS 622A.320, Respondent may, but is not required to, file an answer to this Complaint with the Board.

PURSUANT TO NRS 622A.330, Respondent may seek limited discovery from the Board.

As the Respondents, you are specifically informed that you have the right to appear and be heard in your defense, either personally or through counsel of your choice. You have the right to

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respond and to present relevant evidence and argument on all issues involved. You have the right to call and examine witnesses, introduce exhibits, and cross-examine opposing witnesses on any matter relevant to the issues involved.

You have the right to request that the Board issue subpoenas to compel witnesses to testify and/or evidence to be offered on your behalf. In making this request, you may be required to demonstrate the relevancy of the witnesses' testimony and/or evidence.

The purpose of the hearing is to determine if the Respondent has violated the provisions of Chapter 640C of NRS and if the allegations contained herein are substantially proven by the evidence presented to further determine what administrative penalty is to be assessed against the Respondent, if any, pursuant to NRS 640C.710.

If you require the services of an interpreter, one will be provided for you at no charge. Please notify our office by calling (775) 687-9955 or emailing nvmassgebd@lmt.nv.gov by Tuesday, December 31, 2024, of your request.

Should the Respondent fail to appear at the hearing, a decision may still be reached by the Board. As the Respondent, you are further advised that you may be charged with the attorney's fees and/or costs associated with the hearing pursuant to NRS 622.400.

Pursuant to NRS 233B.121(5), informal disposition of this case may be made by stipulation, agreed settlement, consent order, or default. Any attempt to negotiate this case should be made by contacting Senior Deputy Attorney General, Todd Weiss at tweiss@ag.nv.gov or (702) 281-5256.

Pursuant to NRS 241.033(2)(b), the Nevada State Board of Massage Therapy may, without further notice, take administrative action against your license and/or certificate to practice within the State of Nevada if the Board determines that such administrative action is warranted after considering your character, alleged misconduct, professional competence, or physical or mental health.
